- This is a joint opportunity funded from a research grant on inequalities and inequities in Indigenous health (co-PIs: Mohammad Hajizadeh and Yukiko Asada) and a research grant on inequalities and inequities in health and well-being among older adults (co-PIs: Yukiko Asada and Jeremiah Hurley). The post-doctoral fellow is expected to assist analyses for these projects.
- In addition, the post-doctoral fellow is encouraged to develop his/her own research project in health equity.
